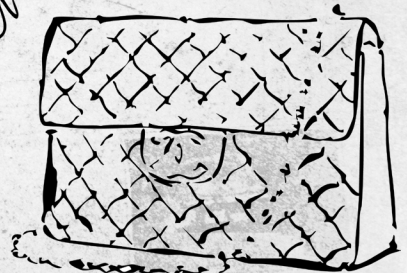

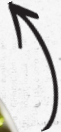

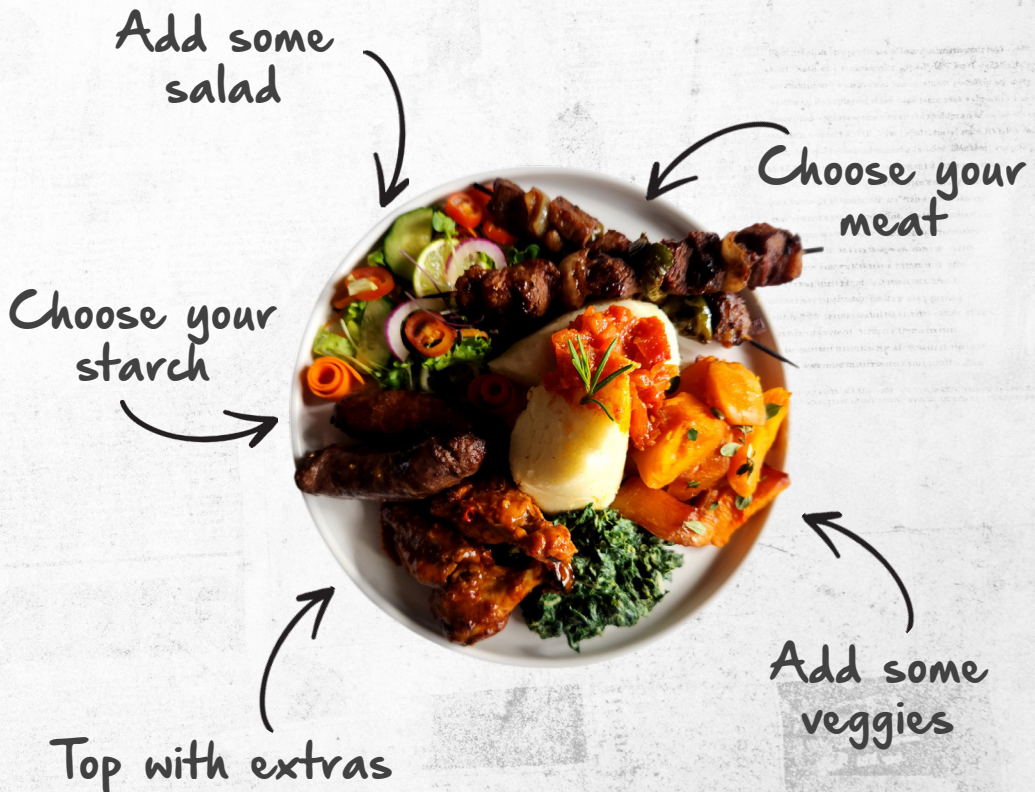

Our Inspiration

The brand Coco Chanel has long had its reputation in the world of fashion, but few people know that it was Coco Chanel who gave women bathing suites, pants slacks, costume jewellery and of course Chanel No.5, still the number one selling perfume in the world. She was named in the Time 100 as one of the most important people of the century.

This is her story...

While Coco Chanel gained world recognition, her early years, however, were anything but glamorous. Gabrielle Bonheur "Coco" Chanel was born 19th August 1883 in Saumur, France. Little is known about her childhood except that when she was 12 years old her mother died of tuberculosis. One week later her father left the family, abandoning her at a provincial orphanage. For six years Chanel was raised by the nuns, who taught her how to sew, a skill that would prove to be very useful in her future life.

As soon as Gabrielle turned 18 she left the orphanage to become a famous singer. She moved to a little town south of Paris called Moulins, where she started singing at prestigious clubs and cabarets. It was during this time that she was named "Coco" which as Chanel later explained was a "shortened version of coquette the French word for 'kept woman'".

While she failed to get steady work as a singer, at the age of 22, Coco met Etienne Balsan, a young French textile heir who suggested that they live together. Chanel agreed and moved to Balsan's castle, where she first began designing hats as a hobby. While she enjoyed the beauties of the "rich life" that Etienne lavished on her, she never got use to her position as his mistress. She wanted to make a name for herself, not just be introduced as "Balsan's companion".

In 1909 Chanel met a rich English businessman Captain Arthur Edward 'Boy' Capel and fell madly in love with him. Capel, a wealthy member of the English upper-class installed Chanel in an apartment in Paris and financed Chanel's first shops. It is said that Capel's own artorial style influenced the conception of the Chanel look.



The design of the Chanel No.5 bottle had two probable origins, both attributable to the sophisticated design sensibilities of Capel. It is believed that Coco adapted the rectangular, bevelled lines of the Chanel toiletry bottles he carried in his leather travelling case or it was the design of the whiskey decanter Capel used. Chanel so admired this, which she wished to reproduce it in an "exquisite, expensive, delicate glass". Their affair lasted nine years and even after Capel married an aristocratic beauty in 1918, he did not completely break off with Chanel.

His death in a car accident, in late 1919, was the single most devastating event of Chanel's life. She commissioned the placement of a roadside memorial at the site of the accident, which she visited in later years to lay flowers in remembrance. Twenty-five years after the event, Chanel then residing in Switzerland, confided to her friend Paul Morand: "His death was a terrible blow to me. In losing Capel, I lost everything. What followed was not a life of happiness, I have to say." Chanel immersed herself in her work and in a short period of time took her already thriving business to new heights. In 1920 she launched her first perfume, Chanel No.5, which was the first perfume to feature a designer's name. Her second revolutionary design was Chanel's little black dress. She took a colour once associated with mourning and showed just how chic it could be for evening wear.

A few years later she also introduced the now legendary Chanel suit with a collarless jacket and well-fitted skirt. Borrowing elements of men's wear and emphasizing comfort over the constraints of the then-popular fashion, she helped women say good-bye to the days of corsets and confining garments. "Luxury must be comfortable, otherwise it is not luxury" was her motto! By the age of forty Coco had become an idol. Women adored her clothes. Men were taken with her impeccable style and independent and outspoken personality. In 1923 Chanel met the richest man in Europe, the duke of Westminster and the two started a decade-long relationship. He offered to marry her, a proposal many women consider great fortune. But not Chanel. She refused, explaining: "There have been several Duchesses of Westminster, but there is only one Chanel!"

The economic depression in the 1930s had a negative impact on Chanel's company, but it was World War II that led her to close her stores. No one expected that in 1954 at the age of 70 she would return to Paris, bringing a new collection with her. On February 5th (5 chosen by her as her lucky number) she presented it to the world. The verdict of critics was ferocious. "A fiasco," was how the Daily Mail opened their story. Chanel ignored the criticism and soon her feminine and easy-fitting designs won over shoppers in Great Britain and America.

Coco Chanel died on January 10th, 1971, in her apartment at the Hotel Ritz. In 1983 designer Karl Lagerfeld took the reins at Chanel's company and continued her legacy.
